



Park Your Car and Walk

Help Keep Gaea Beautiful

It is important that we try to keep driving to a minimum while on property. There are several reasons for this. To begin with, it is in our mission statement that we support ecologically sound practices. It may be easier to drive down the hill to go to the shower or the lake, but is it better for the environment? It is also mentioned in the respect agreement, "Please restrict driving - park, walk, exercise and enjoy the land."

Excess driving also damages our roads. Every year, monies must be budgeted to care for the roads and repair damage of us, being at camp is a wonderful that occurs throughout the season. The less we drive, the less damage we cause. That leaves more money for other projects that we would all like to see accomplished.

Our Rules for Pets

All dogs must be on a leash, and under your control. This means the leash is in your hand.

Although you believe your animal will never harm someone, you cannot predict every situation.

You don't know how another animal, or another person, may react to your animal running up to them.

Dogs are NOT allowed in the Dining Hall or Bath House.

You must clean up after your dog when it makes messes (i.e. poop).

Additionally, driving more than is really necessary creates traffic and parking difficulties. Besides the obvious difficulties resulting from the two way traffic on such a narrow road, our smaller parking areas become congested when people drive to shower or get ice. These areas are really only intended for limited and short term parking.

Of course there are exceptions for those with mobility issues. For the rest opportunity to get some exercise and enjoy the natural surroundings. Let's leave the cars parked and help keep Gaea beautiful!

Earth Rising, Inc. Intern Program

The Earth Rising, Inc. board has implemented a program that is designed to encourage active participation in the running of Camp Gaea. The Earth Rising, Inc. board is committed to providing a clear and concise list of expectations which will allow a person who is interested in the intern program to understand what is expected of them, and how they might have the opportunity to become a voting member. Being part of the intern program is not a guarantee of board membership, however, any future board member will be expected to have been an intern for a period not less than 6 months, or to have previously served on the Earth Rising, Inc. Board of Directors for a term not less than 6 months.

An intern should be willing to commit themselves to:

- Be a self starter. Take on a project and stay with it. Identify areas that need help and develop a
 plan to improve it. Either create a project, or work with the board to identify what needs to be
 done.
- Attend all meetings. While exceptions will occur, an intern needs to make ERI meetings a
 priority. Being part of the decision making process is one of the primary responsibilities
 associated with being a board member.
- **Be the example and not the exception.** Setting an example is one of the most effective ways to communicate with people who are camping at Gaea.
- Show good faith in resolving personal issues that might arise during the normal course of board business.
- **Take the time** to connect with other board members and stay abreast of the issues at hand. It will be the responsibility of an intern to stay in the loop.
- **Show** that consideration of the overall well being of the camp is your first concern when new policies are being debated. Working with Earth Rising, Inc. is not the same as being an advocate for a special event or one of the Exclusive Rental groups.
- Exhibit objectivity when making decisions.

This outline is designed to assist an intern in their efforts to work with the board. It is not meant to discourage people from becoming involved if they aren't willing to donate as much time as would be required for an intern; rather it is meant to help a person understand the level of commitment that is required to sit on the board of Earth Rising. After a period of 6 months as an intern, that individual may apply for a position on the board if an opening exists or they may continue on as an intern and apply when an opening becomes available if they so choose.

Keep Gaea Wild

Please do not feed any animals that you do not own. This refers to wild, stray and domestic animals. Feeding the wild animals encourages them to come into people's camps and steal food; this is dangerous as this can also provoke a wild animal to attack. Feeding strays also encourages them to come back to camp, and to enter people's camps and steal food. We do not want to encourage strays to stay on the land. Feeding domestic animals that you don't own may cause problems with that animal. You do not know if that animal may have a food issue, or is food aggressive.

Make sure that you are not leaving food out overnight that wild or domestic animals can get into. This will also save you from a mess the next day. We appreciate your cooperation and your help in keeping Gaea wild!

Work weekends are a good opportunity to give back to Gaea, and earn some Gaea Bucks too! Check our <u>facebook page</u> for more information on projects as it becomes available.

Respect for the land is vital in the attempt to maintain "a natural setting". A great deal of thought has gone into the way that we treat the land. Rules like cleaning up campsites, not littering, walking as much a possible rather than driving all over camp, and parking only in designated areas may seem like an inconvenience at times. Nevertheless, these rules are in place to protect the land and keep it beautiful. Respect for the land is truly fundamental to preserving the beauty of this place.

Please read the Mission Statement, the Respect Agreement, and the Rules and Regulations of Camp Gaea before visiting. These are all available on the website at http://gaearetreat.org/. If there is a question as to the meaning of any part of these, please speak with the caretakers, or any member of the board of directors. They will be happy to help.

Any violation of the Respect Agreement should be immediately reported to a caretaker of Camp Gaea, or any member of the board of directors of Earth Rising Inc .

A Note From Gaea Safety

Earth Rising Inc. (ERI) is the 501c3 non-profit organization that runs Gaea Retreat Center. We hold two annual festivals on the land., Earth Day and Laid Back Labor Day. These two events are organized and run by the Board of Directors of ERI, other events are organized by other groups and provide their own security and safety teams.

In the last few years, we have made several changes with the purpose of making us more effective at our job. That job is to help you.

Brightly colored shirts help us to be more visible. We WANT you to approach us when you need assistance. We are here to provide basic first aid, and to contact EMS if more care is needed. We are also here to help whenever people violate the rules or the respect agreement.

Each Safety shift is run by someone with emergency medical experience, security experience, or both. I renew my own certification for First Aid/CPR/ and AED with the American Red Cross every two years, and I encourage the rest of the team to do the same. We have added an AED (automated external defibrillator) to the safety equipment at Gaea. It can be accessed quickly if it is needed. Our crew is all volunteer, and we can always use more skilled people. If you have medical or security training, please consider doing a work exchange with our crew.

We have a dedicated Safety Tent now, at the top of the stairs. This was new for LBLD 2016. It is staffed continually throughout the festival. This is a meeting point for our volunteers, a place to provide first aid, and a well-lit place to find us anytime you need help. We distribute ice water and Gatorade from the Safety Tent as well. Remember to stay hydrated! At LBLD last year, we also set up a smaller Safety Tent at the beach. It has been difficult to provide assistance there in the past. We had two volunteers in place there throughout the festival. They were also asked to have a vehicle there in case someone needed immediate transport. We did not set this up for Earth Day 2017 due to chilly weather and a lack of beach activity, but we plan to staff the beach for LBLD.

A handbook has been created for our volunteers, first distributed at LBLD 2016. It is basic directions on what is expected of them as part of the Safety team, and information pertinent to doing the job.

Every year, every event, we are trying to improve the ability of our group to serve the community. The people who have come together to form the core of this group are deeply committed to keeping our events as safe as possible. Please do your part and ask for help when you need it. It all beings there. We are trying to be available and present as much as possible. When you need our help, please do not hesitate to ask! Whether it is a medical concern, or an issue involving the rules or respect agreement, we are here to help.

to encourage the free exchange of ideas, views and experiences...


to promote greater understanding and respect between groups and individuals...
